Have you heard of 'Maycember'? It is a trending term that refers to the chaos and stress of December, but during the month of May. It's especially relevant in the education world, where students, parents, teachers, and staff all feel the heat as end-of-school-year activities abound: exams, papers, concerts, awards, senior nights for athletics, banquets, prom, graduations, confirmations, parties... the list goes on.

Four years later, they went out with a bang, earning an astounding \$1.97 million in scholarships for higher education. Of the 49 graduates, 46 will be attending tech schools, colleges, or universities, with several intending to pursue church work as educators or musicians.




The Crusader Class of 2024 celebrates with silly string at the commencement service.
