These updates are designed to enhance enrollment outreach, strengthen the school's academic framework, and streamline student services. Three current staff members, Mrs. Heidi Krueger, Mr. Ryan Adameak, and Mr. Al Holzheimer, have accepted expanded roles and additional responsibilities to fulfill these essential needs of the school.



Heidi Krueger has accepted the role of Admissions & Marketing Director. Bringing families into the Sheboygan Lutheran community requires a dedicated focus on hospitality, clarity, and connection. Heidi will step into the vital role of Admissions Director, serving as the primary point of contact for prospective families and overseeing student outreach, recruitment, and retention. She will continue to manage strategic marketing and public relations endeavors for the school as well.



Ryan Adameak will serve as our Curriculum and Instruction Specialist. To maintain Sheboygan Lutheran's reputation for academic excellence paired with a distinct Christian worldview, Ryan will work behind the scenes with the faculty to focus on curriculum development and alignment, instructional support, professional development, assessment and data coordination, and technology integration. Alumni Spotlights

Matt Rusch, Class of 1999



Matt Rusch graduated from Sheboygan Lutheran High in 1999. During his four years at LHS, Matt was involved in varsity golf and baseball. His favorite memory was his only home run in a regional final baseball game.

Matt began his golf course career in high school at Town and Country Golf Course in Sheboygan. After high school, while studying at Anoka Tech College, he became affiliated with Majestic Oaks Golf Course in Blaine, MN, and moved to Applewood Golf Course in Golden, CO from 2005-2014. An ownership change led him to Chandler, AZ. In 2018, Thompson Golf was looking for a Director of Agronomy. Matt was hired and now oversees eight golf courses for Thompson Golf in Arizona, Texas, and Minnesota. He is responsible for managing their budgets and agronomy plans, reporting to their Boards, and making sure the courses are in mint condition for membership. Perfection is always the goal. Complications like water regulations in Arizona can be particularly challenging. Matt has been incredibly successful in this high-pressure job, and his goal is to grow alongside the Thompson Golf organization.

Matt's advice to someone considering golf course management is to pursue this, as the interest in golf course maintenance is declining. The job can be difficult at times, yet also very rewarding. Growth and success are unlimited based on a person's goals and effort.

Rachel Bohnhoff, Class of 2011

Rachel Bohnhoff, has blazed a trail perhaps no other LHS alumnae has walked—that of teacher/missionary work in Africa. This is a remarkable story about how God has worked through her to spread the Gospel in a faraway land.

Rachel graduated from LHS in 2011, then from Concordia University Nebraska with her teaching degree. She taught at Faith Lutheran in Crystal Lake, Illinois and Mayer Lutheran High in Minnesota before the missionary work took over. Rachel had always wished for a teaching abroad situation, and her first teaching assignment in Illinois had a Pastor and parishioner who encouraged her to pursue this dream. Rachel accepted a teaching position through Mission of Christ Network to teach English in Senegal, Africa. After much deliberation, Rachel began the process of onboarding and fundraising to live overseas.



Rachel's school was in Hann Mariste, inside Dakar, the capital of Senegal, with over 3 million people. This was a K-12 school with 300-400 students. Rachel primarily taught English from 2022-2026. Rachel shared a powerful witness statement regarding her ministry: "I am growing in my faith so much. When I first went overseas, I struggled to see that what I was doing was impactful or important. But as my time in Dakar progressed, I found my stride in teaching and sharing the Gospel through class time. I saw the impact of making time for people, encouraging and building relationships, and making sure others felt seen and loved. I know the gifts God has given me, and I find great joy in using them for Him."

Rachel will continue her overseas work, serving next year as a high school English teacher at the Christian Academy in Japan. Rachel suggested that others might think of an overseas ministry because, "It helps us to see we are not alone in following God. It helps us to have empathy and understanding for people from everywhere. And, because it can be incredibly scary and overwhelming, it forces you to put your trust and reliance solely on God."

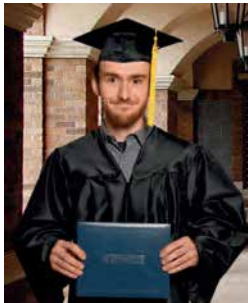

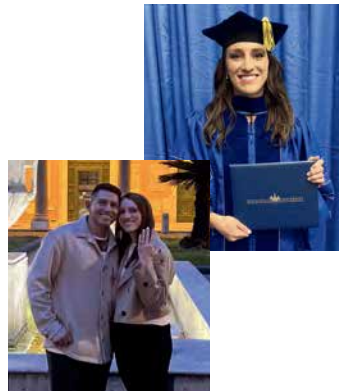
